What we want to offer

- Locked In has developed a curriculum called “Unlocked: 5 Steps” that is a non-religious, non-12 step program whose mission is to promote understanding and insight into the cycle of self-destructive behavior. To fulfill our mission our team has developed an intensive 12-week program that shines a light on inner conflict in a unique and creative way.

What is Unlocked: 5 Steps?

- The 5 Steps are a guide to help those in need to escape the cycle of destructive behavior. Each step has several elements which are aligned to give the most impact combining the dialogistic practices of several diverse cultures (Iroquois: talking circles and African: Dare`) with the strategies of artistic visualization, humanistic therapy, cognitive behavioral therapy and non-violent communication. The 5 Steps are effective in encouraging youth who struggle with expressing themselves. Through heartfelt expression and attentive empathetic listening the steps support the clarification of values, co-visions and inclusiveness.

Target Plan

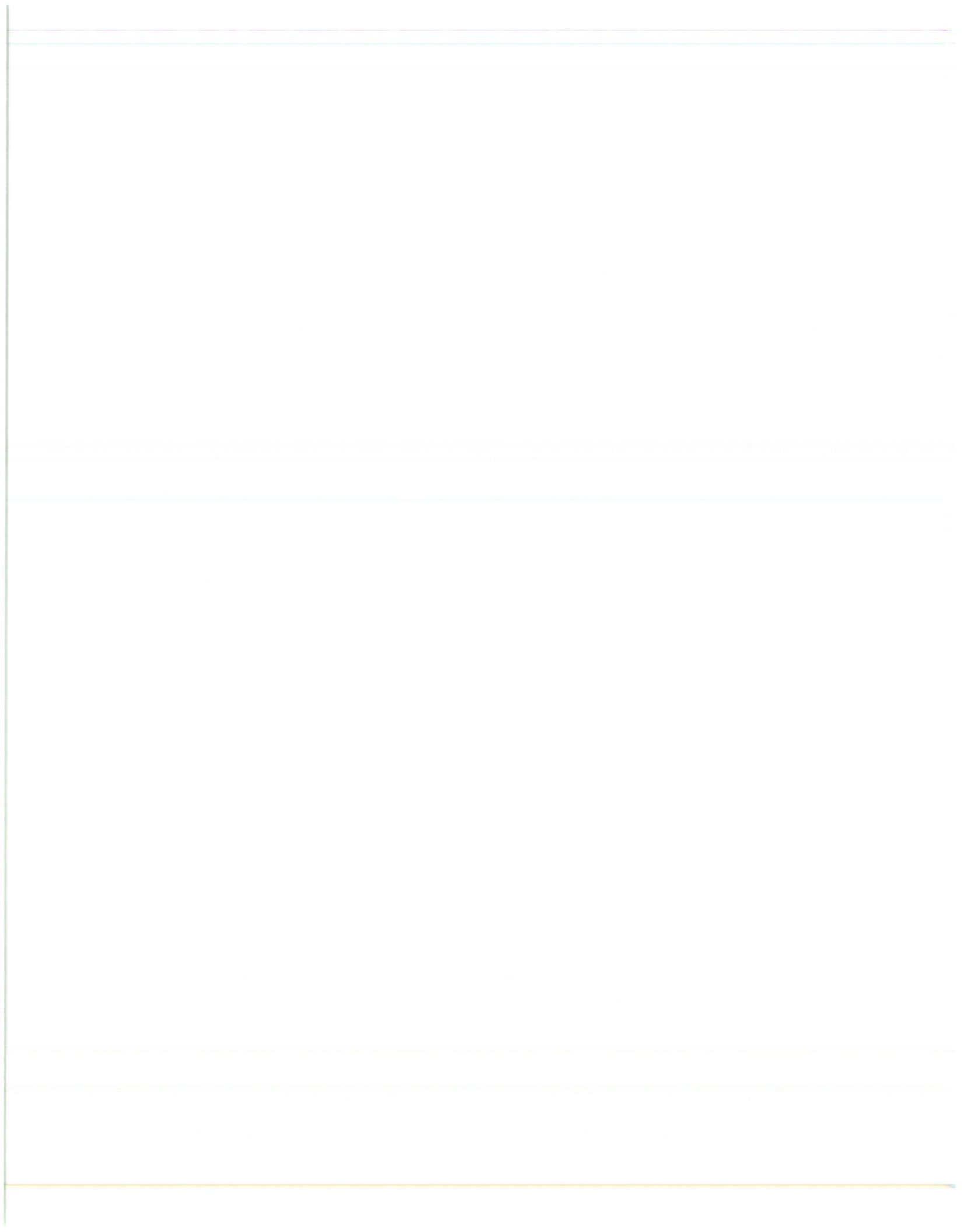
- We plan to target youth from adverse backgrounds who are showing signs of acting out, criminal behavior, drug use, gang mentality, tough home life, and mental health struggles.
 - We plan to work with the Riverside County school systems and courts to identify individuals who are at risk and have them entered into our program in place of school punishment or jail.
 - We plan to target those incarcerated in our jails and prison systems and offer a modified version of this curriculum.

Goal and Summary of Program

- The goal is to have 4 cohorts of 20 students (80 individuals) every quarter (15 weeks) reaching 520 targeted youth a year.
 - The program is 12 weeks long (1 day for 2 hours with lifework assigned and daily one-on-one mentorship throughout program from a mentor who has been system impacted)
 - A 1-day workshop offered week 13 is dedicated to the parents/guardians to learn from a licensed family therapist tools on how to have healthy communication and involvement in the participants' lives.
 - *Some topics covered are:* triggers, love needs, coping strategies, who am I, making amends, words and deeds, and words of letting go.

How can this benefit the community

- Alumni program maintains youth connectedness and engagement in the community by keeping the youth in their environment and getting involved/invested in their community
 - A reduction of premature involvement in the “deep end” of the juvenile delinquency system
 - A reduction in cost compared to court processing and/or secure placement
 - Mentorship brings results- Research confirms that quality mentoring relationships have powerful positive effects on young people in a variety of personal, academic, and professional situations.

How can this benefit the community cont.

Young adults with a mentor are :

- Less likely to-
 - skip a day of school (55%)
 - skip class (57%)
 - start using illegal drugs (46 %)
 - start drinking (27%)
 - *More likely to-*
 - participate regularly in sports or extracurricular activities (81%)
 - volunteer regularly (78%)
 - be enrolled in college (55%)
 - hold leadership positions (150%)

1. Build constructive behavior and reduce poor behavior by increasing tools and strategies to overcome trauma
 2. Promote mental health, social emotional skills, and positive pro-social development
 5. Enhance empathy, self-esteem, while reducing stress and anxiety
 4. Create a safe environment for participants to express themselves without judgment
 5. Encourage and support participants in all healthy lifestyle changes
 6. Guide participants in the forgiveness of self and others
 7. Increase student engagement in school leading toward school retention and successful completion of academics allowing the student to graduate and transition into a healthy pro-social lifestyle
 8. Decrease youth truancy and youth involved crimes in the community
 9. Increase better communication between parent/guardian and child.

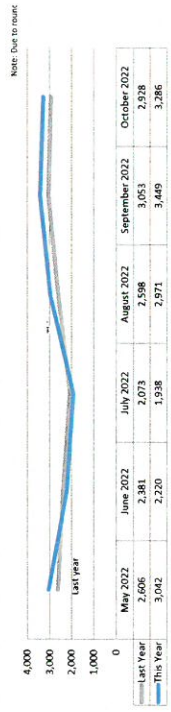
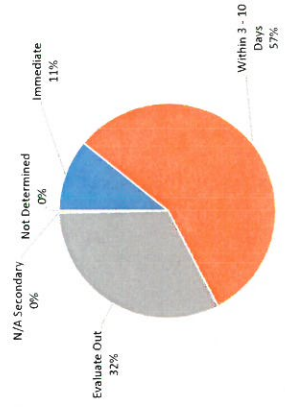
